Wayne Scott Inspector of Mines

- 2000 23 yr old trail bike rider dies after falling 9 metres over a quarry face
- 2001 Loader driver ran over and killed a 13 y old trespasser he was chasing (NSW)
- 2005 Large quantity of explosives and detonators stolen from surface coal mine
- 2008 24 yr old man dies when he jumped from a highwall at a coal mine near Brisbane into water 37 metres below.
- 2013 16 yr old boy drowns in closed quarry
- 2014 Activist who shut down Idemitsu's Boggabri (NSW) mine fined \$300. They scaled a 40 metre high coal loader..... Shut the mine for 6 hours.



OBLIGATIONS:

•Duty of care (Common law)

•To take reasonable and necessary action to ensure that persons are not exposed to an unacceptable risk

•To ensure the operators' own safety and the safety of others is not affected by the way the operator conducts operations



Hazards are obvious !! Risks vary ?

RECOMMENDED CORRECTIVE ACTIONS

- Wire netting/light weld mesh fitted to barrier fences in critical locations.
- Community awareness level raised by public meeting and public notices.
- Barriers and warning signs to be inspected more frequently for damage and unauthorised access (particularly during school holidays).

Review security measures


- •Out-of-hours security
